WALKING THROUGH THE HOLY WEEK



Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week, one of the most significant moments of the Church year. During this week, we journey with Christ from his triumphant entry into Jerusalem to his final meal with his closest friends and ultimately to his death on the cross. Before the reform of the rite by Pope Pius XII, the blessing of the palms occurred inside the church within a liturgy that followed the general outline of a Mass, with the Collect, Epistle and Gospel, as far as the Sanctus. ****** The palms were then blessed with five prayers, and a procession went out of the church and on its return included a ceremony for the reopening of the doors, which had meantime been shut. After this the normal Mass was celebrated.

The days between Palm Sunday & Maundy Thursday are known as Holy Monday, Holy Tuesday, and Holy Wednesday (Spy Wednesday).

- On Holy Monday, some observe the anointing of Jesus at Bethany (John 12:1–11), an event that in the Gospel of John occurred before the Palm Sunday event described in John 12:12–19. Other events which the Gospels tell of which may have occurred on this day include cursing the fig tree and the Cleansing of the Temple.
- On Holy Tuesday, some observe Christ's predictions of his own death, as described in John 12:20–36 and John 13:21–38.
- On Holy Wednesday, the story of Judas arranging his betrayal of Jesus with the chief priests is remembered; he was a spy among the disciples of Jesus (Matthew 26:14–25). For this reason, the day is sometimes called "Spy Wednesday".
- Maundy Thursday: We commemorate 3 anniversaries:
 Anniversary of the institution of the Eucharist,
 - 2. Anniversary of the Institution of the Priesthood
 - 3. Anniversary of the Commandment of Love.

Catholic parishes practice the foot washing (Maundy) ceremony on Maundy Thursday.

Good Friday commemorates the crucifixion of Jesus and his subsequent death. Outside the afternoon liturgical celebration, the altar remains completely bare in Catholic churches, without altar cloth, candlesticks, or cross. The Roman Rite liturgy consists of three parts: the Liturgy of the Word, the Veneration of the Cross, and Holy Communion.



- Holy Saturday (Black Saturday) is the day between the crucifixion of Jesus and His resurrection. On Holy Saturday the Church waits at the Lord's tomb in prayer and fasting, meditating on his Passion and Death and on his Descent into Hell, and awaiting his Resurrection. The Church abstains from the Sacrifice of the Mass, with the sacred table left bare, until after the solemn Vigil, that is, the anticipation by night of the Resurrection when the time comes for Paschal joys – the abundance of which overflows to occupy fifty days.
- Easter Vigil: The name of the Easter Vigil, even if the vigil is held on what on the civil calendar is still Saturday, indicates that liturgically it is already Easter, no longer part of Holy Week, but still part of the Easter Triduum. The Easter Vigil is one of the longest and most solemn of liturgical liturgies, lasts up to three or four hours, consists of three parts:
 - 1. The Service of Light
 - 2. The Liturgy of the Word
 - **3.** The Liturgy of Baptism: The sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation for new members of the Church and the Renewal of Baptismal Promises by the entire congregation.
