



### *PASTOR'S NOTE*

#### **Review and Renew**

*A happy feast of Christ the King. May he reign in our lives*

The feast of Christ the King brings the church's year to a close and with it comes a reminder that the cycle of our own lives here on earth will also reach its completion. The end of the year is a review time and affords us the opportunity to take stock of our behavior as members of God's household. The gospel points out very forcibly that admission into our eternal home depends on the effort we make to aid and comfort the needy. We will be assured of a place in Christ's kingdom only if we treat others as Christ treats them. This Gospel asks us whether we are for Christ or against Christ. None of us can reflect upon it without seeing areas of our lives where change and improvement are needed.

The teachings of the Gospel emphasize the importance of turning our lives and hearts to Christ and trusting in his teaching; otherwise, we run the danger of being rejected. God is going to judge us on the works of mercy we perform which is our response to human need.

As the world around us is put into our hands in trust and stewardship, Christianity lays great stress on involvement in the community. Jesus is still walking the earth in the guise of our neighbor who is suffering and in want. Our shortcomings as a people is that we fail to recognize this fact. He has laid it on the line that in the evening of life we shall be judged upon the love we have shown and the small acts of mercy we have performed. Christ becomes real to the people around us only in so far as we reach out and show concern for their welfare and commit ourselves to fostering their dignity. Christ rules in our hearts and in the world around us when we give of our time, energy and love in performing practical acts of charity where our King reigns forever.

**BLESSED MIGUEL AGUSTÍN PRO (1891-1927)**  
**November 23**

Graham Greene's classic *The Power and the Glory* immortalized Mexico's persecuted Church of the 1920s. But photographs of Father Pro—arms outstretched to image Christ Crucified, kneeling in prayer before the firing squad, crumpled dead on the ground—vividly, visually remind us that not long ago, not far away, the faith we take for granted cost everything! Born to a mining family, Miguel became a Jesuit and was sent to study Catholic labor movements in Belgium in preparation for evangelizing Mexico's workers. But he returned to find a Mexico determined to annihilate Catholicism, and, like priests before him during Roman persecutions, England's Reformation, and in China today, ministered secretly to an "underground Church" until apprehended and sentenced to the firing squad. In his final moments, Father Pro blessed his executioners, forgave his enemies, and shouted: "Viva el Cristo Rey!—Long Live Christ the King!"—his defiant, dying proclamation of ultimate, transcendent loyalty. Father Pro's martyrdom reinvigorated that beleaguered Church, whose countless faithful, never again afraid, would throng John Paul II when he visited Pro's beloved Mexico fifty-two years later.

## **Update on the Society of St. Vincent de Paul**

### **St. Patrick's Angels Camp Conference**

**November 22, 2020**

In January we lost our Treasurer and an original member of our St. Vincent de Paul Society, Sharon Sobon. We were very blessed to have her so involved in our organization and she has been dearly missed.

**Although our services this year have been limited due to the Corona Virus we have maintained some aspects of our ministry and have the yearly update on our progress.**

- We had 129 visits with clients which helped 108 individuals/families in our community
- Gave out 39 items from our Furniture Ministry;
- Began a laundry ministry last fall and assisted 33 people during the time we were open
- Gave gas vouchers and bus passes to the rectory for people who came asking for assistance
- Have helped homeless/jobless clients with stays for up to a week at local hotels during the COVID Pandemic
- Referred clients to other organizations that could better assist them;
- Our total costs for the above services were \$7,637 from our account

All help has been provided by our volunteers. At this time we are asking for parishioner assistance in order to keep this service going to help those less fortunate than we are in the community.
